Questions to Consider Based on Your Role





For Administrators to Contemplate:

- Who is responsible for leading and supporting data initiatives at your school?
- What organizational structures and programs are currently in place to help teachers effectively use data? What is missing?
- Are your goals set at the school level or provided by the district? How
 does that affect how you approach these goals?



For Instructional Leaders to Ask Teachers:

- What strategy did you use in that instance? Looking at the data, how
 effective do you think that strategy was? If you were to reteach this,
 what else might you try?
- Why do you think your approach worked or didn't work?
- Is there another approach that may have reached more students?



For Teachers to Ask Students:

- What evidence or clues from the question and/or answer choices could be used to help find the expected answer?
- What strategy could you try to find the answer next time?
- What patterns do you notice?
